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Established in 1956, Kampong Lorong Buangkok is the last kampong (meaning village in Malay) on mainland Singapore. Located in the north of Singapore, about 30 Chinese and Malay families still live there. The houses, connected by dirt roads, are made mostly of wood and have zinc roofs.

The little kampong received electricity and running water in 1963, two years before the independence of Singapore.

In 2010, a jogging track was linked from Sengkang Riverside to back of the kampong, allowing joggers to enjoy the peaceful, rustic ambience of the place.
